### Introduction

The Demographic WorkBook examines selected variables in 21 counties in the New York metropolitan area for African Americans, Asian American and Latinos. The variables include population size, ancestry, educational attainment, home ownership, and income. Each variable is broken down at the county and then zip code levels. Comparisons are made between the 1990 and 2000 profiles. The overall objective is to provide a portrait of each of the three ethnic groups by county and to show zip code-level concentrations of population and indices of income and assets.

At the beginning of each section of tables is a map grouping several proximate counties. The maps are designed visually represent the data, with shaded zip codes indicating the number of households with incomes of \$75,000 or more. The darkened areas may have a heightened philanthropic potential for the particular racial/ethnic group under examination.

# **Explanatory Notes**

#### \*ZCTA

Data are reported for the Census Bureau's ZIP Code Tabulation Areas (ZCTA). ZCTA, a new statistical entity developed by the U.S. Census Bureau for tabulating summary statistics from Census 2000, overcome difficulties in defining the land area covered by each US Postal Service ZIP Code. In most instances, ZCTA codes equal the ZIP Code for an area. The term ZCTA was created to differentiate between this entity and true USPS ZIP Codes.

# \*Race and Hispanicity

Data from replies to questions on race and Hispanicity are reported in several ways. The category 'All Blacks' includes persons who report on the race question that they are Black and persons who also report they are Hispanic on the Hispanicity question. The

category 'Black, Non-Hispanic' contains fewer cases because it includes only persons who indicate that they are Black on the race question but who report that they are *not* Hispanic.

Similarly, the category 'All Asians' includes all persons who report their race as being 'Asian', regardless of how they answer the Hispanicity question. The category 'Asian, Non-Hispanic' includes persons who report they are Asian on the race question and *not* Hispanic on the Hispanicity question.

# \*Income Adjusted for Inflation

Adjusting for inflation, \$75,000 in 2000 dollars was approximately equal to \$55,000 in 1990. To make comparisons between 1989 and 1999, we compared households whose earnings were in the income categories of \$50,000 or higher in 1989 to households in income categories of \$75,000 or more in 1999.
